Funds received from the government are manage through software such as Public Financial Management System and Integrated Financial Management System.

Despite the college being committed in implementing the parameters for criteria 6.1.1, the NAAC peer team have given a lower score than anticipated. Therefore, the college would like to kindly request to reconsider the points that have been awarded to criteria 6.1.1. taking into account the evidence provided in the supporting documents.
