The RFID Solution is a revolutionary application of Automatic Identification and Data Capture (AIDC) technology. In a library environment, RFID technology resembles a traditional barcode system in that it provides a means of assigning an ID to an item and reading that ID to perform circulation transactions or to take inventory. But while RFID technology resembles a traditional barcode system in application, the RFID Solution is far superior in performance and features and in addition it offers built-in security. The advantage RFID has over barcodes is that it does not require line of sight for reading the ID of the item. The technology, though new to libraries, has been in use in other sectors for more than 50 years. The RFID labels are placed in books and generally covered with a property sticker. Antennas of different sizes, based on application, are used to read the book labels and manage the various library functions.

The Directorate of Higher and Technical Education, Govt. of Mizoram providing funds for College Library in Mizoram through New Economic Development Programme (NEDP) and focus to Library Digitization. The Govt. put allocation for fund of Rs 15 lakhs each for all 24 College in Mizoram . RFID is one of the major item to be introduced in the College Library.

Knowing that the INFLIBNET SOUL Support Centre, Govt. Hrangbana College with The Library Committee organized Training on RFID in Collaboration with Stallion System Solution Pvt.Ltd, Kolkata during 11th to 15th September, 2017. Mr. Surangsu Pal, Addl Managing Director, Kolkata was invited to be a resource person.

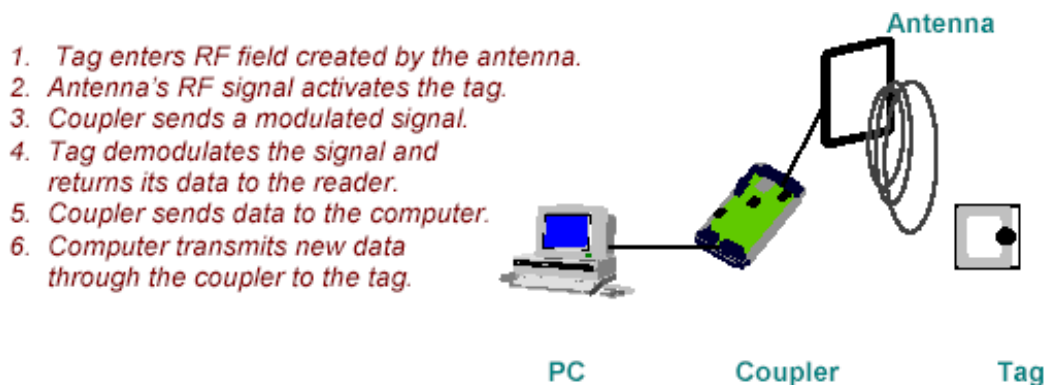
There are 12 participant in the training from different Colleges which is less in number, the reason may be short notification and busy in their respective works.

There are four main component in the standard RFID:-

1. RFID smart labels
2. Antenna
3. Coupler
4. Computer

Trade Centre, Chanmari, Aizawl provided a refreshment for the participants at Free of Cost.



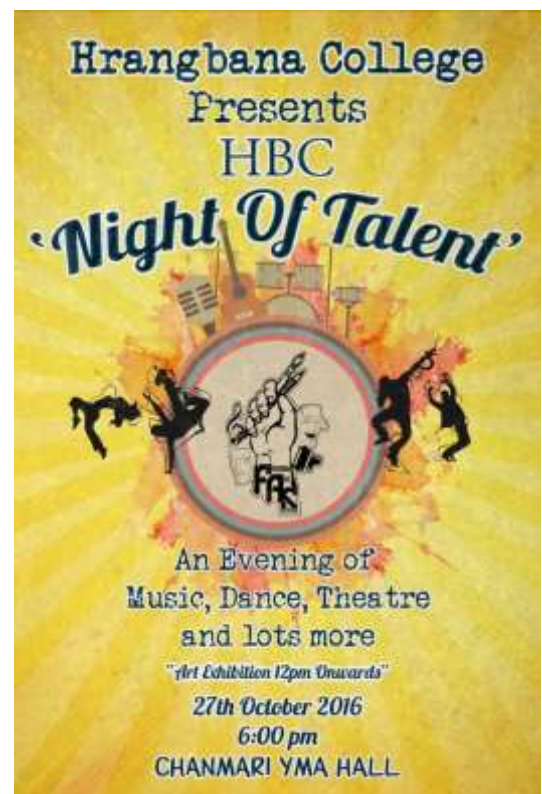

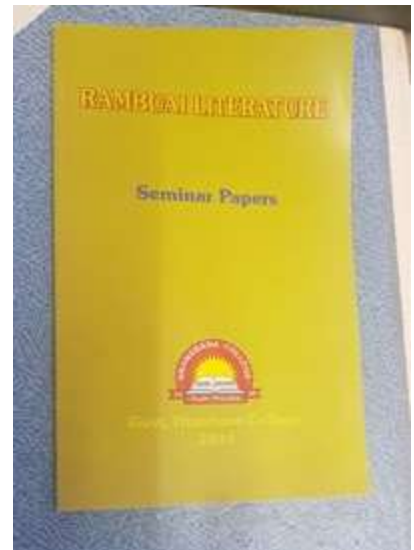

Hrangbana College against UGC Grant received vide letter No. F.8-04/SEM. Conf./ NERO/ 2013-14 F.D diary No 15571 Dated 3.3.2014 for ` 52500/- (Rupees fifty two thousand five hundred) only. It was done within the sanction for which it was sanction and Utilization statement along with voucher for settlement.

In the workshop, all SOUL users of College Library in Mizoram were invited. Out of 25 Colleges in Mizoram, 23 participants enrolled their names that are a good number.

On the first, our respected Principal, Shri Lal Rinawma inaugurated the Workshop and tea brake follows. Tow technical resource persons Mr Anupam Sharma and Mr Sangchhuankuma took class for practical Demonstration. Good discussion with questions and answer was nicely done in the workshop. The other days follows trouble shooting, repair update of the software was conducted to each and every College Library as per requirement.



2013-2014

2012-2013

1. The IQAC in collaboration with DOEACC Society, Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, Government of India.(now NIELIT) organised for the faculty of the college a course on Computer Concepts(CCC) for 15 days, i.e., 22nd March-4th April, 2013 where 12 of the faculty participated. This particular training was held at Zuangtui, the main office of NIELIT as the computers and other facilities were available at the specified place only. It was an intensive programme with online examination for CCC at the end of it. It was a fruitful initiative of IQAC as teaching and learning was greatly enhanced by the computer knowledge.



2. **Seminar on Gender Based Issues in Mizo Society** organized by Govt. Hrangbana College & Aizawl District Legal Services Authority on the 22nd March 2013 where 15 faculty members as well as the students of the college participated. Officials from the District Legal Services were the resource persons and the faculty of the Mizo Department also serving as faculties to throw lights on the historical basis of the topic.

Besides this, various librarians and library staff of the Mizoram state participated in this even, in an attempt to familiarise and get training for the Library automation process, which was a relatively new issue at the time.

REPORT OF 2ND INFLIBNET REGIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME ON LIBRARY AUTOMATION

The five days Training programme was started with the inaugural function on the 30th April, 2012 at 10:00 am with the welcome address by Mr K.Liantuala, Principal, Govt. Hrangbana College. While welcoming the participants attending the Training Programme from different parts of Mizoram, the Principal highlighted the importance of libraries in the colleges and wished all the participants a fruitful training programme. The Introductory speech was given by Mr. Lalchatuana, Co-ordinator and Librarian, GHBC who highlighted how the training programme is organized for the second time and also pointed out the existing users of SOUL 2.0 software.

Prof. Pravakar Rath, Head, DLIS, MZU in his keynote address stated how library profession is going to be developed and also stressed the importance of developing skilled and competency in a network environment and the impact of library automation. He also pointed out the services which can be provided by using library automation software.

Mr. H.G. Hosamani, Scientist C, Inflibnet Centre gave insight to the different services and programmes provided and organized by Inflibnet Centre.

Prof. R. Lalthantluanga, Vice Chancellor, MZU and the Chief Guest of the Inaugural Function in his address highlighted the development that have taken place in the library profession and noted the improvements which could be seen among the college libraries and urged the librarians to go for further improvement so that the students can benefit more from the services provided by the library.

The inaugural session ended with Vote of thanks which was proposed by Mr. Vanlalpeka, Asst Professor, GHBC.

During the five days Training Programme, there were 7 (seven) Technical Sessions in which Resource Persons from Inflibnet Centre and local resource person gave lecture with practical demonstrations on the different modules of SOUL 2.0. The participants also had the opportunity to have on practice during these Technical sessions.

In this Training Programme we have 32 Registered participants from different colleges of Mizoram including the special libraries and Research Scholars from Mizoram University and we are glad to inform this gathering that all the participants are very serious and regular in attending the sessions and it is also hoped that some development will be achieved through this Programme by the college libraries of Mizoram.

As already mentioned earlier in the inaugural session, there were 13 college libraries who were using SOUL 2.0 for automating their respective libraries and we are happy to inform this auspicious gathering that there is another 4 (four) college libraries who had purchased SOUL 2.0 this time. So the total number of college libraries who will be using SOUL 2.0 software for automation of library will be 17 in numbers. The colleges who had purchased the software during this programme are:
